Vineyard Pruning Practices for Growers and Agents in Mississippi and Louisiana

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Objectives:

Conduct vineyard (grape and muscadine) pruning workshops in Mississippi and Louisiana.

- Discussion of vineyard best management practices
- Pruning demonstrations in the vineyard
- Hands-on practice for workshop participants

Abstract:

The muscadine is a popular home crop across the South because of its natural adaptability, resistance to diseases and insects, and long vine life. Muscadines can be included in home plantings on fence-rows or homemade trellises. The fruit is used for unfermented juices, wines, jams, jellies, and pies. Although more challenging to produce in the Deep South, bunch grapes are an emerging crop. Along with interest in craft brewing of beer, there is renewed interest in home and small-scale commercial winemaking.

Two vineyard workshops sponsored by the Southern Region Small Fruit Consortium were held in March 2022. The first was hosted at the Mississippi State University Beaumont Horticultural Unit in Perry County, MS and the second at the Louisiana State University Horticulture Hill Farm in Baton Rouge, LA. The Beaumont Horticultural Unit is a 20-acre branch of the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station. The vineyard contains a variety of muscadine and bunch grape cultivars ranging in age between 3 and 45 years old. This makes the vineyard an excellent location for demonstrating the care and pruning of new vines as well as the rejuvenation and care of older vines. The Horticulture Hill Farm Teaching Facility is a site on the LSU campus that is a formal and informal teaching facility dedicated to horticulture science. There is a small demonstration orchard for teaching fruit production that includes a vineyard. Muscadines in the Louisiana vineyard are all grown in 40-gallon containers and trellised.

The programs covered the basics of vine anatomy and pruning techniques for muscadines and bunch grapes. After the presentations, in-field demonstrations provided participants the opportunity to practice correct pruning techniques. The MSU event was attended mostly by home gardeners along with two vineyard producers and two Extension agents. The LSU program was attended by 19 horticulture Extension agents and 2 professional growers.

Felco #2 pruners were given to participants to utilize during the workshop and to use in their own operations.






